The Shoalhaven Heads pool has long opened in early November, but this year residents were surprised to find the start of the swimming season pushed back to 29 November, almost four weeks later than usual. The change appeared without consultation, even though an early-November opening had been advertised throughout winter.

The frustration has been amplified by comparisons with other village pools. Berry, Kangaroo Valley and Greenwell Point will all open on Saturday 1 November, the first weekend of the season. Shoalhaven Heads has traditionally followed the same schedule.

Dave Schofield from the Heads Surf Club said the decision makes little sense for a community that depends on its pool.

"The Council website had the pool opening in the first week of November, the same as Berry, Greenwell

Point and Kangaroo Valley," Dave said. "Then it suddenly changed to the 29th with no explanation. There's been no consultation at all."

He said the delay affects many groups in the community, including older residents who use the pool for gentle exercise and surf-club nippers who need to complete swimming tests before the patrol season.

"It means people have to travel to Bomaderry or Berry just to do things we should be able to do here,"

Clr Selena Clancy has taken up the issue, lodging a Notice of Motion for the 11 November Council meeting seeking to open the pool two weeks earlier and close two weeks later next season. Her proposal would set the 2025-26 season from 14 November 2025 to 29 March 2026, extending the current schedule by four weeks.

"The community has been very reasonable about

this," Councillor Clancy said. "The Heads pool has opened in early November for years. We just want to keep it consistent with the other villages."

Council staff are preparing a costing for the extended season, estimated at around \$19,000, and are considering practical options for managing staffing and costs. Councillor Clancy has also asked for an investigation into non-patrolled pools, so smaller communities like Shoalhaven Heads can operate longer seasons without full-time lifeguards.

Although the pool was built by Council in 1972, its care and character have always reflected the local community. The colourful mural painted by Shoalhaven Heads artists in 2015 and the surrounding trees planted by volunteers have made it a place of shared pride — and for many, the heart of summer in the village.

MOW MAKING THE MOST OF ITS KITCHEN UPGRADE

There are smiles all around at the Meals on Wheels kitchen following a much needed upgrade to its equipment.

"Our volunteers are producing 100 more meals per month compared to the previous year due to increased demand, and prior to the upgrade we were just using domestic equipment like electric frypans to do it," says Shoalhaven Heads MoW President Deb Gately.

"The new professional equipment has a much bigger capacity, and we are still getting over how easy it is to use."

The \$23,500 upgrade was made possible by a \$8,500 grant from the Bowling Club, with the rest funded by dipping into the organisation's reserves that had been accumulated over the years.

"It was a big decision to do this, but the committee decided the benefits were worth it," says Deb.

"The old gas oven and hot plates have been replaced with a much more efficient turbo oven and state of the art induction hotplates.

"And the multiple electric frypans have been replaced by something called a bratt plan - a heavy duty commercial cooking appliance with a deep rectangular pan that can perform multiple cooking functions like





frying, braising, boiling and steaming."

The next big capital expense will be replacing the walk-in freezer.

"We've been keeping it running with bandaid solutions, but have been told that it is on its last legs," says

"We are busy saving all we can and applying for grants to make this happen next year. We are very appreciative to have been chosen as one of the beneficiaries of the fishing clubs' raffle and Charity Day, and will be putting this donation towards the new freezer."

COUNCIL ADOPTS RIVER MANAGEMENT PLANS — BUT DEBATE CONTINUES OVER FLOOD TRIGGERS

Shoalhaven City Council has formally adopted both the Shoalhaven River Entrance Management Policy (EMP) and the Lower Shoalhaven River Coastal Management Program (CMP) at its meeting on 28 October 2025, bringing years of policy work to a close — though debate continues about how flood risks are managed at Shoalhaven Heads.

Both documents were carried unanimously.

The EMP sets out how Council will respond to river and entrance conditions during flood and low-flow events, while the CMP covers broader management of the lower river and estuary.

As part of the vote, Councillors agreed to remove the proposed "Living Foreshore" project from the CMP before submitting it to the NSW Government for certification

Councillor Selena Clancy said she was pleased to see the plans progress but acknowledged the strong local interest in how the river is managed.

"This has been a long process," Councillor Clancy said. "The EMP and CMP both passed unanimously, and removing the Living Foreshore project reflects what the community has been saying for some time."

She confirmed that a five-year mangrove-removal permit for Shoalhaven Heads is in progress and said she expected further updates from Council staff short-ly

Robyn Flack, a member of the Shoalhaven Heads Estuary Taskforce, submitted a written deputation supporting adoption of the EMP but outlining serious reservations.

"The community who endures the effects of regular flooding will be extremely disappointed in the outcome of this review," Robyn wrote.

She argued that the modelling used to set the current mechanical-opening trigger levels — 3 metres AHD at Nowra and 2 metres AHD at Shoalhaven Heads — does not reflect what actually happens during floods

when the entrance is open.

Her deputation included data showing lower flood peaks when the entrance is open, and urged Council to consider those real-world observations in future reviews.

At the meeting, staff noted that the new EMP includes builtin flexibility, allowing field conditions and

forecasts to guide decisions rather than relying solely on modelled trigger levels.

That reassurance has been welcomed cautiously in Shoalhaven Heads, where many residents say the proof will be in the pudding when the next major rain event tests how those provisions are applied.

Despite her concerns, Robyn thanked Council's flood-management staff — particularly Mark Stone — for their willingness to engage with the community and described the final policy as "the best of the worst options" given the modelling constraints.

Councillor Clancy said adoption of both documents allows Council to move into the implementation and monitoring stages, and that community feedback will continue to inform that work.

"This is not the end of the conversation," she said. "There will be opportunities for ongoing review as more data becomes available."

While the adoption marks a milestone for Council, discussion around flood-trigger levels, entrance management and river health is set to remain a central issue for Shoalhaven Heads residents for some time yet.

Grass fire in Tindalls Lane

Hi Everybody. The Brigade rolled on 14 different jobs this past month, the first of note had the potential for very serious ramifications.

Smoke sighting from town

We, along with Brigades from Broughton Vale, Beaumont and Gerringong attended a smoke sighting on Coolangatta Mountain.

A resident had lit several small Piles of native vegetation, on relatively well prepared land. Imagine their horror when fire escaped one pile, igniting the grassland and proceeding uphill, in the direction of the National Park.

We arrived to find the homeowners working feverishly to contain the fire, using buckets and rakes. With the aid of the other Brigades, we relayed water from Fire Truck to Fire Truck some 60 metres up the hill to extinguish the fire and black out the whole area.

It is a legal requirement to apply for a Permit to light a Pile – all year round. During the Bushfire Danger Period, any Pile in our area is to be inspected by an RFS Fire Permit Officer before a Permit can be issued.

Please, if you're not sure, visit "Notify us of your planned burn" on the RFS web page or call us.

MVA on Terara Road

A few days later, there was a single Vehicle Accident where an SUV had run off Terara Road. Fortunately it was not a "high speed" incident and no one was injured, which was lucky considering the size of the trench on the northern side of the road. With Greenwell Point Brigade, we helped manage the traffic and made safe a minor spillage while the vehicle was recovered.

Grass fire in Tindalls Lane

Just before lunch on Tuesday, we responded to a Grass fire in Tindalls Lane, Berry. Our Cat1 teamed up with units from Broughton Vale and Gerringong RFB to contain the fire in next to no time.

Illowra Hazard Reduction

In the middle of last month, we sent a crew on the Cat 1 to assist with the Illowra Hazard Reduction at Hyam's Beach. Six other Brigades attended where a low intensity burn was successfully conducted over 3ha, adjacent to residences.

Recently, five of our members were presented with citations from the RFS Commissioner for services rendered during the 8 day Manildra Silo fire of May 2024. You may recall 600t of product was smouldering in a 1350 cubic metre grain silo. This silo was located adjacent to similar sized silos.

Fearing an explosion, the site was evacuated of nonessential staff and an exclusion zone was established. RFS members contributed to 120 firefighter shifts over 6 days, working alongside FRNSW personnel to achieve containment.

The citation read in part, "The Shoalhaven District

and Fire and Rescue NSW Region South 1 are awarded the "Commissioner's Certificate of Commendation (Unit)" in recognition of the collaborative, professional and considered approach to emergency response and management by our NSW firefighting agencies."

Australia PUSH GROWS TO RESTORE SHOALHAVEN HEADS POST OFFICE

The loss of the Heads Post Office has left resi-

dents frustrated and increasingly vocal about the need for a local postal service.

The Shoalhaven Heads Lions Club has launched an online petition at change.org, urging Federal Member for Gilmore Fiona Phillips to lobby the Ministers for Finance and Communications to restore postal services in the village.

"The lack of a post office in our village is causing stress and financial strain," the petition reads. "We can't pay bills, withdraw cash or send parcels. It is particularly hard for residents who have no transportation or mobility issues. For those with transport, there is the burden of time and fuel costs."

The petition highlights Australia Post's Customer Service Charter, which promises "trusted, relevant

and reliable services that connect all Australians." The Lions Club says that commitment is not being met in Shoalhaven Heads, and that older residents and those without transport have been hit hardest.

The group is calling for "workable opportunities for a postal service to operate in Shoalhaven Heads", noting that other regional areas have found alternative models that allow postal agencies to operate successfully in smaller towns.

Councillor Selena Clancy said she had spoken with residents, small businesses and accommodation providers who are all being affected.

"It's not just inconvenient," Councillor Clancy said.
"For many it means extra travel, lost time and added costs, especially at the busiest time of the year."

Councillor Clancy has written to Fiona Phillips, asking her to raise the matter with Australia Post and fed-

eral ministers. She said she fully supports the Lions Club's initiative and will work with both Australia Post and the Federal Member to explore every possible solution.

Residents have already begun sharing their views on the petition site:

QUESTIONS OVER \$40 MILLION ROAD FUNDING

Federal Member for Gilmore Fiona Phillips has questioned why Shoalhaven City Council has yet to start work on a \$40 million federal package for road repairs across the region.



TOO EASY APPLE CAKE

Not everything totally delicious or time consuming as this easy apple cake shows.

It cooks up into delicious and moist accompaniments to a cup of tea and if you add the splash of brandy or rum, you can also pretend to a modicum of sophistica-

But really this is all too simple. Put all the ingredients into a bowl, pour into the tin and cook.

That's all there is to it. Enjoy.

Fennel roasted chicken

Ingredients

- 130g unsalted butter softened and cut into pieces, plus extra for greasing
- 3-4 cooking apples peeled, cored
 1 tbsp baking powder and cut into quarters
- 3 eggs Method
- 150g caster sugar 30 g brandy (optional)
- 200g plain flour
- 1 pinch salt
- icing sugar for dusting (optional)

Preheat oven to 180°C. Grease a round cake tin (23 cm) and set aside.

With a sharp knife, make parallel incisions on the outside of each apple quarter, cutting down but taking care not to cut completely through. Set apple quarters aside.

Place butter, eggs, caster sugar, brandy (optional), plain flour, baking powder and salt into bowl or beat thoroughly until smooth. Pour mixture into cake tin and spread evenly with spatula. Place reserved apple



quarters on top, one next to the other, with incisions facing up.

Bake for 30-40 minutes at 180°C or until a wooden skewer inserted into the centre of the cake comes out clean. Allow cake to cool in tin for approx. 10 minutes before transferring onto a serving plate. Dust top of cake with icing sugar to serve (optional).

Granny Smith or golden delicious varieties work well in this recipe. Leave the apples unpeeled if desired.

You can use a smaller tin: increase the baking time and reduce the number of apples.

Pears prepared in a similar fashion to apples work well. Stone fruit is also delicious. Cut in half and remove stones. The main thing is to have enough fruit to distribute evenly over the top of the cake.

Use rum instead of brandy if you like.

WILDLIFE MATTERS - DIVE, DIVE, DIVE!

The Australasian Diving Gannet is one most unique birds found over the oceans of Australia.

These coastal birds are divers and plunge into the ocean at high speeds from a height of up to 20 metres. Although gannets usually fly solo at sea, others will join in when they see diving occurring.

Their preferred diet is pilchards, squid, anchovies and schools of fish. Yet, pil-

chards are the preferred meal providing essential nutrients and fats to support their energy requirements.

Returning to their nests, they feed their solo, annual chick some regurgitated fish. When the babies are fully grown, they will outweigh their parents. They act territorially around their breeding and roosting grounds.

An adult gannet is about 91 cm long and will weigh 2.3 kg. They have white and black feathers and striking yellow plumage on their head and neck.

Gannets are mostly silent over the oceans, yet boisterous around their colony. They announce their arrival and threaten predators.





Gannet pairs are monogamous and have long term bonds remaining together over several seasons until the death of one of them.

Gannets are not an endangered species and their population is large. However, the biggest threat to them is commercial fishing which impacts on their food supply. Climate change has also been noted as having an impact on their breeding cycles and the number of single birds.

BOTANIC GARDENS A BUZZ ABOUT THE MISSING BEES

Hello gardeners and nature lovers, have you noticed an (eerie?) quiet in the garden lately? The absence of European Honey Bees! Since Verroa mite was inadvertently introduced into Australia hives across New South Wales have been decimated. While we need honeybees for our fruit trees and some vegetables, there are many native pollinators. I'm no expert so I won't go into too much detail, but there are insects like hoverflies (who look deceptively like wasps), wasps, flies, and of course, native bees, all visiting flowers, spreading pollen and collecting nectar.

CSIRO estimates there are over 2,000 types of native bees in Australia. In the Botanic Garden we have two hives of Tetragonula carbonaria, which seem to be thriving on all the lovely plants in flower. Competition from honeybees has also declined. They also produce honey but, as Nowra is as far south as they can

survive, we don't remove the honey. They store honey for the winter when they won't leave the hive until temperatures rise above 18 degrees.






